


Q: What extra-curricular activities will be available to its students?

- We hold follow-up meetings with new parents in September and October

Certificates are presented to students, with their parents, in UCC in recognition of their attendance

Summer Camp

A number of First Year students are invited to attend a Summer Camp in UCC and CIT at the beginning of June. Students have great fun learning about the colleges and courses.
